Welcome

In 1979, a small group of parents seeking a distinctly Christian education gathered to create a vision that would enrich Whitefish for decades to come. The following year, a small Christian elementary school then named Cross Currents Christian School was incorporated and welcomed its first students, setting forth a path for Christian educational excellence.

From the seeds of that first vision Whitefish Christian Academy has continued to grow. Three events best embody that growth:

- In 1996 WCA built its current campus on Ashar Avenue to accommodate its burgeoning student body;
- In 2005 our Academy officially adopted the classical and Christian educational model, which has been the hallmark of the Academy education to this day;
- And in 2022, WCA earned accreditation from the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI), a confirmation that, forty-four years since that small group of parents first met, our Academy remains committed to enduring, Christ-centered excellence.


Classical & Christian


FACILITIES

- O1 Prayer: Our Faculty & Staff meet weekly to pray for students, families and one another. A current goal is to expand and further those prayer opportunities.

 Biblical Literacy: Our middle school has begun a survey of the Bible designed by Dr. Paulson; a present goal is to determine how to best build on the success of that survey in coming years.
- O3 Service: Discover and engage in service opportunities locally in our Valley.
- O4 Songs of Praise: Build on the 2022 Christmas choral success, to more deeply root a love for worship through song in our students.

Curriculum



5 Year Vision

That WCA continues in its time-tested classical & Christian curriculum, yet has refined it in key ways. That refinement, though, will maintain the following priorities:

- The cultivation of a biblical worldview
- Habits that reflect the Seven Christian Virtues
- Sound reasoning & rhetoric
- Literacy in The Great Books and Art.

The Academy aims to build on its present foundation through the following initiatives.

- O1 By refining our curriculum maps and scope and sequence documents to reflect our cohesive grade-to-grade curricular approach.
- O2 Through high-level discussion with classroom teachers to obtain feedback on currently utilized instructional programs.
- O3 By compiling and analyzing Milestone testing data to find common strengths and weaknesses across grade levels.
- O4 By exploring professional development seminars that further expand our teachers' pedagogical expertise and bolster curricular initiatives.

Student Enrichment & Retention



5 Year Vision

That our Academy offers its students and their families the valley's best in these areas:

- Extracurricular & enrichment opportunities
- Social-emotional resources
- Athletics
- In-class and out-of-class support

The following focuses aim to bolster those key categories.

1-3 YR FOCUS

- O1 The implementation of further processes that identify a student's learning needs so that support systems can be put in place to ensure that student's success.
- O2 The refinement of policies and procedures that address student behavior and discipline.

And in the same vein: The launch of programs that safeguard a student's social-emotional wellbeing.

- O3 The expansion of mentoring, discipleship, and service opportunities for our students.
- O4 The doubling of class sizes in the lower school, which aims to one day produce greater class sizes in our middle school.
- O5 The further development of our Art Program.

Faculty, Staff & Leadership



5-YEAR VISION

That WCA retains and continues to hire the best educators in the valley, and that our educators find our school environment to be one that encourages growth and flourishing in their areas of expertise.

The following represents initiatives towards that growth and flourishing.

- The refinement of roles & responsibilities, where necessary, to ensure both that key tasks are accomplished and that staff are fulfilled.
- O2 The establishment of more systematized performance evaluations for both employees and Board members.
- The implementation of further training opportunities, both for the Board and for our employees.
- O4 The exploration of community development ideas to foster greater community between all those involved with our school.
- O5 The solidification of staff succession plans.

Finances



5-YEAR VISION

That we fulfill the following priorities:

- Sound financial governance based on conservative & biblical principles
- The upholding of non-profit standards
- The establishment of a Teacher Endowment designed to fund our teachers in such a way that their pay fully matches their expertise.

To realize those goals we intend to put the following into motion.

- O1 The development of a 10-year forecast and the approval of a 3-year comprehensive financial plan.
- O2 The completion of a financial review by an external CPA with no affiliation to WCA. That is to be done upon completion of our current accounting transition.
- The execution of our Full-Time-Employee target salary increase plan.
- O4 With the increase in available finances, we aim to expand our administrative roles (e.g., Admissions, Development, Counseling, etc.) to ensure all key tasks are overseen sufficiently.

Facilities



5-YEAR VISION


That our facilities mirror the high quality of our education, and to arrive at that end that we achieve the following:

- Classroom expansion to provide two classes per grade, starting in Pre-K
- Building enhancements to beautify our current location
- The identification of opportunities to provide new athletics and multi-use spaces.

To achieve those goals we have the following focuses.

- O1 We aim to update our current facilities in adherence with permitting requirements. Those updates will both beautify our space and allow for short-term student population growth.
- 02 Enhanced building security.
- In the finalization and execution of our short-term expansion plans, we'll explore the acquisition of acreage on Whitefish Stage, as well as building plans for a new multipurpose room and additional lower school classrooms.

Advancement & Development




5-YEAR VISION

To arrive at Phase II we look to accomplish the following:

- O2 The establishment of a Stewardship Program, which aims to cultivate further alumni engagement.
- O3 The preparation and launch of Phases II & III of the Capital Campaign (see Capital Campaign for details).

That our reputation for providing an excellent education in the classical and Christian traditions reaches all corners of our valley, and that our parent community is further unified through a deeper, richer understanding of our classical & Christian approach.

To arrive at that twofold goal we seek to implement the following.

- O2 An Advisory Board to help gather and disseminate key information.
- O3 A wider, deeper understanding of our classical Christian education among parents to achieve greater school identity, unity and focus.
- O4 Effective annual surveys to gather school-wide opinions to then improve WCA activities and events.
- O5 An expansion of current church community outreach and networking.

2026 & Beyond

YEARS 4-6

- Launch of Phase II of Capital Campaign to support growth and operation of:
 - Gymnasium
 - Campus expansion
- Expansion of second 2-5th grade classes

YEARS 7-10

- Launch of Phase III of Capital Campaign to fund expansion plans beyond lower school
- Expansion of 6th-8th grade classes
